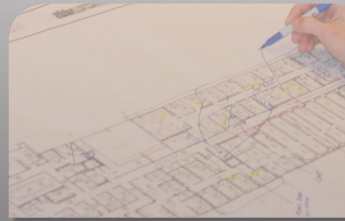

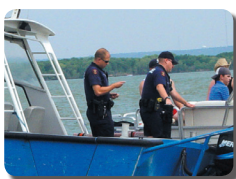

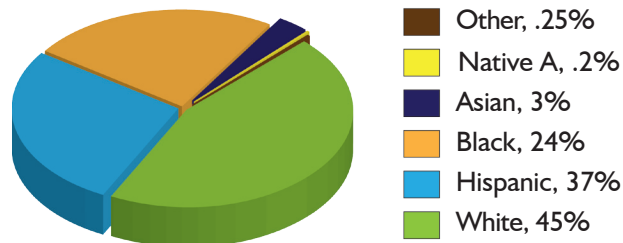

Victim Assistance Program **972-237-8796**

Passed by the Texas Legislature in 1979, the Texas Crime Victims' Compensation Act created a fund and established statutory eligibility guidelines for the provision of certain benefits for crime victims.

In 2009, the Grand Prairie Police Department served 1,380 victims of violent crime. Services included crisis intervention, follow up contact, personal advocacy, information and referrals, criminal justice support and advocacy, assistance obtaining emergency protective orders and filing crime victims' compensation claims.
