

## Tip A Cop



Each year we partner with Texas Roadhouse and help raise money for our Special Olympics Athletes. Grand Prairie Police Officers will trade in their handcuffs for serving aprons at the annual Tip A Cop night held at Texas Roadhouse at 2536 W. Interstate 20 on Thursday, July 26. During the 5:00 p.m. – 9:00 p.m. dinner shift, officers will serve tables and collect tips, which will be turned in as donations to Special Olympics Texas to provide programming for more than 12,600 athletes with intellectual disabilities in the Dallas-Fort Worth area. This event operates under the Law Enforcement Torch Run (LETR), which is SOTX's largest grass-roots fundraiser and public awareness vehicle. Through efforts like Tip A Cop and our Annual Spring Classic Police Motorcycle Competition, Texas LETR raised over \$1.4 million in 2016 to support more than 58,300 SOTX athletes across the state.
